



ENTRY FORM

1. Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship:

This will be a thirty-two (32) team event with four (4) pools of eight (8) teams competing in individual round robins. The pools will be seeded according to the CMDR system. Following these four round robins, twelve (12) teams will then advance to the playoff round. The championship team will advance to the 2020 World Mixed Doubles Curling Championship April 18-26, 2020 in Kelowna, BC.

2. Where & When:

The event will be played March 17-22, 2020 in Portage la Prairie, MB. Teams are responsible for their own travel and accommodation costs. Pre-competition practice starts on Tuesday, March 17th at 10am. First competition draw is Tuesday, March 17th at 6:00pm. The Final is set for 1:00pm local time on Sunday March 22nd. The HOST HOTEL is the **Canada Inns Portage la Prairie** <https://bit.ly/3a9ajuR>. Rooms have been secured at **\$125.00** per night (plus taxes). Please contact Mikki to make your reservation:

3. Teams:

Teams will be comprised of one (1) male and one (1) female. Coaches are welcome and will have access to the field of play for practices and time-outs. However, there will not be a spare or alternate pool nor will alternates be allowed to compete. If a team cannot field two players for any game, they will default the game.

On March 2, 2020 the points accumulated to date will be used to determine a Team's CMDR. The CMDR team points will be accumulated as below:

- June 1, 2018 – May 31, 2019: 75% value carried over from each player's best three mixed doubles point's events.
- June 1, 2019 – March 2, 2020: Mixed Doubles teams best seven results from either mixed doubles events and/or CTRS events. Only 3 CTRS point events will count. (CTRS points are individually based)

The 32 team Championship field will be determined in order as follows:

- Semi-finalists (4) from the 2018 Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship. (Walker/Muyres, Sahaidak/Lott, Martin/Griffith, Peterman/Gallant)
- 1 team, 2019 Canad Inns Mixed Doubles Classic Champion (Jones/Laing)
- 1 team, 2019 Next Gen Mixed Doubles Event Champions (Hawes/Tardi)
- 1 team, 2020 Qualico Mixed Doubles Classic (Homan/Morris)
- 14 teams as winners of their respective Provincial or Territorial playdowns.
- 11 teams from the CMDR



If an invited team or teams decline one of the above spots or has multiple invites, that team or teams will be replaced by the next ranked team not already invited from the CMDR system until the 32-team field is filled.

The 2020 Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship conflicts with the 2020 Women's World Curling Championship. If your team has a player competing at the 2020 Women's World Curling Championship, you will have an opportunity to replace that player. After the member is replaced, a new CMDR will be calculated. The new team will have to be high enough ranked to qualify for the 2020 Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship. (Deadline to re-submit is March 5, 2020)

The non-Provincial / Territorial teams are not subject to the MA Residency Policy nor are they subject to any age requirements.

Fourteen (14) teams will represent the Member Associations. Each MA will be allowed one (1) entry and they will be asked to confirm their team entry within 24 hours of the completion of their Provincial/Territory Championship.

Member associations have autonomy on how they declare their team including residency and age eligibility. MA's are required to declare their intent to send a team by Dec 31st, 2019.

4. Entry Fee:

The entry fee will be **\$200** per team including teams identified by the Member Associations. The entry fees collected will be returned in full as prize money. You can provide us with your credit card information or send a cheque to:

5. Playoff Format:

At the conclusion of the four individual round robins, the top team in each pool will advance directly to the quarterfinals of the championship round. Ties for first place will be decided by who beat whom then by the total distance of the draws for hammer (best 12 of 14). These four playoff teams will be seeded in the draw based on round robin record first, then total draw shot distance second.

The next best 8 records (regardless of which pool they played in) will advance to the round of twelve (12) of the championship. Seeding within this group of eight will be based on round robin record first, then by the total draw shot distance of the draws for hammer (best 12 of 14). **No tie-breaker games will be played.**



6. **Officiating:** The event will be fully officiated by a Curling Canada's Chief Umpire and appropriate Game Umpires.
7. **Game Dress Standards:** Teams will supply their own uniforms. Please see Appendix A. Logo attached.

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MIXED DOUBLES CURLING CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

In consideration of CURLING CANADA accepting my application to participate in the 2020 Canadian Mixed Doubles (the Event), I hereby agree with the following:

1. I acknowledge that I have reviewed the "Rules of Curling for Officiated Play" (Rules) as well as the 2020 Entry Form (Guide) for the 2020 Canadian Mixed Doubles (the Event).
2. I hereby agree to comply with all provisions of the Rules and with all the provisions of the Guide and, in particular but without limiting my agreement to comply with all the Rules and the entire Guide, I agree as follows:
 - (a) The Rules and the Guide apply from the time I leave home to attend the Event until I return home following the Event. That time frame will encompass at least the entire day before the start of the on-ice play at the Event and the entire day following the conclusion of the on-ice play at the Event, as well as all of the intervening period.
 - (b) I understand that the curling CODE OF ETHICS set out at the beginning of the Rules is an intrinsic part of the sport of curling, and of this Event in particular, and I agree to abide by that Code.
 - (c) I have read carefully the DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS provisions of the Rules and agree that any conduct in contravention of the Rules or the Guide will be dealt with by those provisions.
 - (d) I agree to comply with all rules and regulations respecting advertising, promotion, and dress codes established by Curling Canada and its sponsors and communicated to me through the Rules and the Guide.
3. I acknowledge that I have received and reviewed the CURLING CANADA [Privacy Policy](#).
4. I consent to CURLING CANADA and their agent or appointees, on a worldwide basis, to take, use and copyright in their own name:
 - (a) photographing;
 - (b) video taping;
 - (c) filming; and/or
 - (d) recording my voice; and further
 - (e) exhibiting, publishing, and broadcasting my name or any photographs, video tapes, films, or any other likenesses of me or any sound recordings of my voice in any promotion, reports, or advertising about or in connection with Curling Canada or the Event (collectively the "Images").
5. I hereby waive the right to any remuneration, payments or royalties in connection with the actions described in subparagraphs 4 (a), (b), (c) and (d) above and in connection with any exhibition, publication or broadcast described in subparagraph 4 (e) above, regardless of whether such



exhibition, publication or broadcast is on a commercial basis and regardless of whether a fee or rental is charged or paid to anyone in connection with such exhibition, publication or broadcast.

6. I agree to release, discharge, and agree to hold harmless CURLING CANADA for any and all claims, demands, actions, damages, losses, or costs that might arise out of the collection, use, or disclosure of the Images or from the taking, publication, sale, distortion of the Images, plates, negatives, masters, or any other likeness or representation of me that may occur or be produced in the taking of said Images or in any subsequent processing thereof, including without limitation any claims for libel, passing off, misappropriation of personality, or invasion of privacy.
7. For the purpose of promoting the sport of curling during any telecast relating to the Event, I consent to:
 - (a) being interviewed at the Event, and
 - (b) wearing, upon the request of CURLING CANADA, a portable microphone during competition.
8. In consideration of CURLING CANADA allowing me to participate, I, for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, agree:
 - (a) That my physical condition has been verified by a medical doctor to participate in the Event;
 - (b) To remove myself if I sense or observe any unusual hazard or unsafe condition; or feel unable or unfit to safely continue;
 - (c) To ASSUME all risks arising out of, associated with or related to my travel to or from, or attending at, or participation in the Event;
 - (d) To freely ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME all such risks and possibility of personal injury, death, property damage, expense and related loss, including loss of income, resulting from my travel to or from, or attending at, or participation in the Event; and
 - (e) To FOREVER RELEASE CURLING CANADA, its employees, directors, committee members, agents, volunteers, contractors, local organizers from any and all liability for any and all claims, demands, actions, damages (including direct, indirect, special and/or consequential), losses, actions, judgments, and costs (including legal fees) (collectively, the "Claims") which I may have or may in the future, that might arise out of, result from, or relate to my travel to or from, or attending at, or participation in the Event, even though such Claims may have been caused by any manner whatsoever, including but not limited to, negligence, gross negligence, negligent rescue, omissions, carelessness, breach of contract and/or breach of any statutory duty.

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, I further release any recourse, which I may now or hereafter have resulting from any decision taken by CURLING CANADA.

9. I have been given the opportunity to obtain independent legal advice prior to signing this agreement, and fully understand its provisions. No person has attempted to unduly influence my



signing of this agreement. I have signed this agreement on my own after careful consideration of all the provisions. This agreement is to be binding upon myself, my heirs, spouse, children, parents, guardians, next of kin, executors, administrators and legal or personal representatives.

- 10. The termination of this Agreement, for whatever reason, will not terminate any provision, which is expressly provided to continue in force after such termination.

Appendix A

Mixed Doubles Uniforms Requirements for 2020 Canadian Competition

Curling Canada Logos

- Event Logo (Front Left Chest)
- 4" x 4" area must be reserved for the event logo

Last Name on the back of Jackets & Shirts

- Required when the team displays team sponsors
- Displayed across the shoulders
- Letters must be block and 2.5" in height, can be dark coloured font on a light coloured garment, or a light coloured font on a dark coloured garment
- Players' uniforms must match

Team Sponsor Logo's/Cresting

- May be any size and placed as desired on jackets, shirts, or pants (see above for reserved areas)
- Must not conflict with the title sponsor of the Mixed Doubles Canadian Championship or the Mixed Doubles Curling Trials (CANAD INNS)
