MEDIA INFORMATION

IMPORTANT: All media procedures, seating and access is subject to change based on the recommendations of public health authorities. All accredited media will be notified of any changes.

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation can be picked up at the main entrance

All media badges issued for the BKT Tires & OK Tire World Women's Curling Championship are non-transferable. Failure to follow this rule will result in forfeiture of your media credential.

MEDIA BENCH

An event/media area has been set up at the home end of the concourse. The bench offers wireless Internet, electrical outlets and TV's.

MEDIA WORKROOM

A media workroom is set up on the main concourse level at the home end near sheet D.

Saturday through to the conclusion of the event it will open 30 minutes before the first draw of the day and close roughly one hour after the last draw.

The media room has electrical outlets, wireless Internet, a printer and television to assist in the production and distribution of media materials and media services.

INTERVIEW REGULATIONS/PROCEDURES

You will be required to fill out interview request forms, which will be available on the media bench. The forms will be gathered by volunteers as the draw progresses and will be handed to requested players at the completion of their games.

All post-game media interviews will be conducted in a physically-distanced scrum format at ice level in a designated space adjacent to the media bench. All players have been instructed to exit through this area on their way to the dressing rooms. Every effort will be made to escort players to the specified area as quickly as possible after each draw.

All in-person interviews MUST be socially-distanced. Masks are required at all times. Due to the distance, Curling Canada recommends having microphone extender to improve audio quality.

WORLD CURLING FEDERATION PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

PHOTOGRAPHERS REGULATIONS AND CODE OF CONDUCT

All photographers must be identified with an appropriate media accreditation pass – failure to comply with these regulations may result in the immediate withdrawal of your media accreditation pass.

These regulations have been put in place by the World Curling Federation in order to ensure the smooth operation of photographers accredited for World Curling Federation events.

GENERALLY, PHOTOGRAPHERS ARE ALLOWED ONTO THE FIELD OF PLAY DURING CURLING CHAMPIONSHIPS AND CAN SHOOT FROM:

- Anywhere between the hoglines on the carpeted areas separating the sheets of ice
- The corners of the arena
- Behind the sheets of ice, in between the scoreboards, but not directly in front of or behind the scoreboards
- Please pay particularly close attention to rules 4, 8 and 9 on page 4

In all cases, this is provided that you are not obscuring the vision of spectators, blocking the scoreboard, in the way of the players or are a particular visual distraction to the World Curling Federation's host broadcaster World Curling TV or Rights-Holding TV Broadcasters (RHBS).



PHOTOGRAPHING A CURLING CHAMPIONSHIP – THINGS TO WATCH FOR:

• COMPETITION

Team names are posted on the scoreboards.

• PRE-GAME ACTION

Prior to the start of each draw (round of games), each team receives practice time on the sheet of ice they will be competing on, usually starting 30 minutes before game time. The final minutes before the official start of competition are used for team introductions and final preparation of the ice.

• FIELD OF PLAY PERSONNEL

Will try not to obstruct your sightlines. However, they must move to perform their duties and will occasionally interfere with your photography.

• A GAME OF CURLING

A game usually last ten (10) ends. An 'end' usually lasts 15 minutes. The action goes down and back, from one end of the sheet to the other, hence the name 'ends'. Games going to '10 ends' will finish at the 'home end'. However, teams can concede at any point after six ends in round-robin games and eight ends in play-off and medal games. Watch the scoreboard and if a team is losing badly look for players shaking hands and conceding the game early after the last stones have been delivered in an end.

• LAST STONES MAY NOT BE DELIVERED

If a team needs two points to win, and has no stones in scoring position with only one stone remaining to play, the game will end without last stones being delivered.

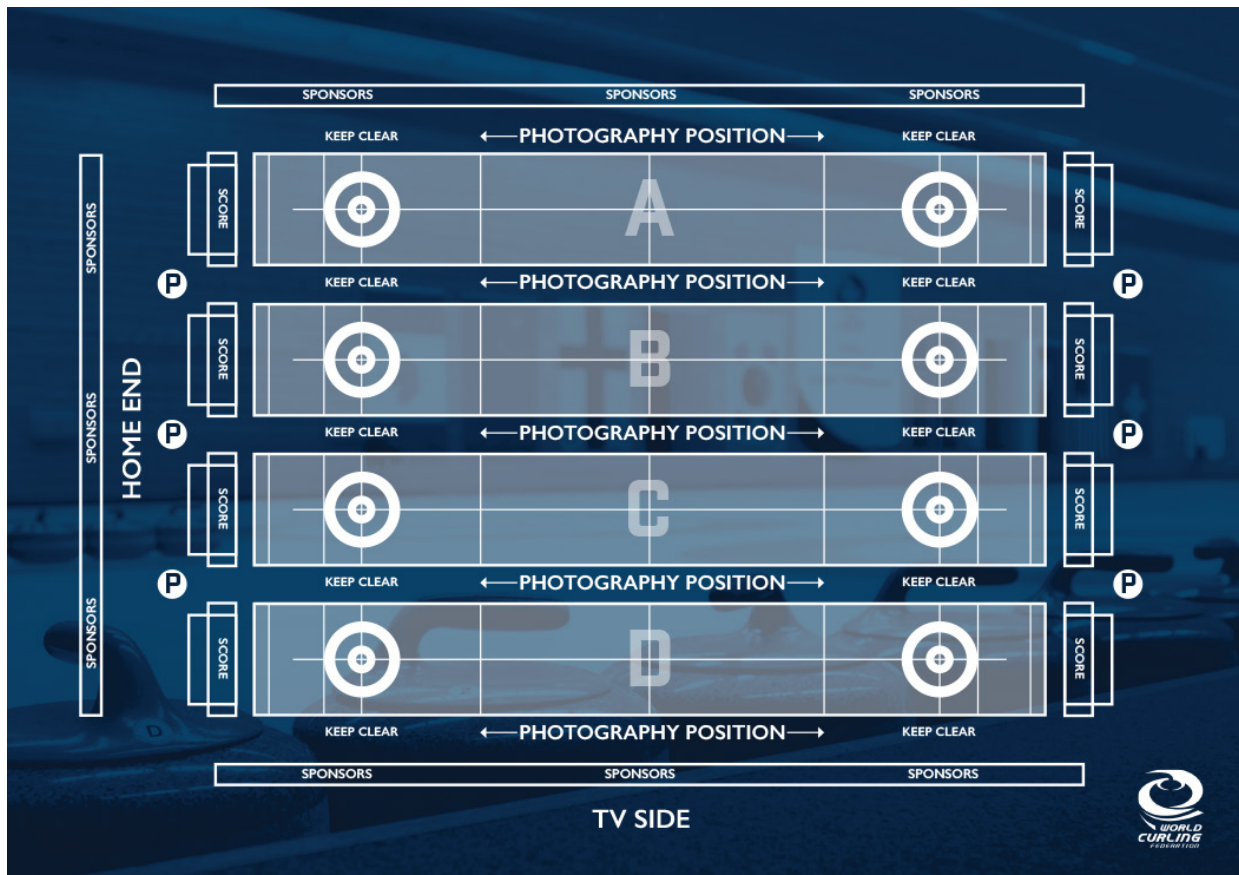


KEY PHOTOGRAPHY RULES



- Flash photography is not allowed at any time.
- Please turn your mobile/cell phone off before entering the Field of Play. Silent or vibrate settings are permitted.
- You are not allowed on the ice surface at any time.
- You are requested to wear black clothing and to wear black shoes that have only been worn indoors or shoe covers whilst at work on the Field of Play. Failure to do so will result in being denied access to the Field of Play and the possibility of accreditation being revoked.
- Please photograph from a sitting/squatting position. Move along the walkway at appropriate intervals in order not to consistently block the view of the same spectators.
- Do not take camera bags and non-essential bulky equipment onto the Field of Play.
- Always walk, do not run inside the Field of Play.
- When preparing to move either along a walkway or across the end of a sheet – remember that other games may be going on at the same time – make sure to look down both adjacent sheets to ensure that no player is in the process of delivery. If one is, then please await the completion of the delivery before moving. When crossing the end, cross behind the scoreboard, not in front. Please be mindful of any WCTV or RHB camera, which may also be on the same walkway.
- If the game you are photographing is being covered by TV please ensure you photograph from the same walkway as the cameras, not the opposite walkway. Please sit alongside the TV camera tripod to stay out of the TV shots.
- When a player is about to deliver a stone, you must be behind him/her or between the hoglines.
- Please be aware that the camera operators may move along a walkway or to a different walkway during any draw. Please cooperate with any request regarding the moving of cables and cameras.
- For the semi-final and final, special instructions will be issued on photography locations. Only one photographer per affiliation will be allowed onto the carpeted area/walkway designated for photographers located adjacent to the game sheet. All other photographers from the same affiliation must position themselves on a non-adjacent walkway behind or to the side of the playing area. Certain photographers may also be allowed a key position behind the scoreboard.
- Photography instructions regarding the presentation of the championship trophy will be issued prior to the final.
- For certain events an armband policy for access to the Field of Play may be implemented.

BROADCAST GAMES



If the game you are photographing is being covered by TV please ensure you photograph from the same walkway as the cameras, not the opposite walkway. Please sit alongside the TV camera tripod to stay out of the TV shots.



TV NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS (INTERNATIONAL MEDIA)

NEWS - ACCESS REGULATIONS & CODE OF CONDUCT



All broadcasters must be identified with an appropriate MEDIA accreditation

The news-access regulations for World Curling Federation championships are designed to permit the broad distribution of broadcast news, related to World Curling events, whilst protecting the integrity of rights holding broadcasters (RHBs) licensed by the World Curling Federation and its media rights agency Infront.

NEWS - ACCESS REGULATIONS & CODE OF CONDUCT



1. The World Curling Federation and its host broadcaster World Curling TV (WCTV), do not allow non-Rights Holding Broadcaster (non-RHBs) cameras or portable video devices onto the Field of Play during any session.
2. In order to allow non-RHBs news access, camera positions will be available outside the Field of Play. These positions should not block the view of spectators or present a fire access hazard.
3. Non-RHBs may air up to 90 seconds of game footage daily.
4. Non-RHBs may have to source game footage directly from the principal rights holder in their country and air a courtesy on-screen credit.
5. Game footage filmed by non-RHBs must be used in regularly scheduled TV news or TV sports news bulletins and cannot feature any sponsorship.
6. Game footage filmed by non-RHBs is permitted on all the non-RHBs platforms (digital, web, social) as long as geo-blocked and respecting length restrictions in point 3.
7. Camera lights must not be directed at the Field of Play if games are still in progress.

The main media Mixed Zone will be positioned off the Field of Play. At the end of a game all athletes pass by this area on their way to the changing rooms.

Priority is given to WCTV and RHBs for post-game interviews. Non-RHBs are requested to allow written media to interview players before arranging individual TV interviews. Non-RHBs may air as much footage from the Mixed Zone as they wish.

At the discretion of the World Curling Federation media team, when all games have been completed for any draw and when WCTV has concluded broadcasts, you may be allowed to do 'stand-ups' or interviews on the Field of Play. This is provided you are not disrupting the ice technicians' work in any way as they prepare the surface for the next draw. You are not allowed on the ice surface at any time.

Failure to comply with these regulations may result in the immediate withdrawal of your media accreditation.

TV NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS (CANADIAN MEDIA)

TSN is the sole Canadian TV rights-holder for the 2022 World Women's Curling Championship, thus no cameras/portable video devices from any other media affiliation are allowed **inside** the boards during morning, afternoon and evening draws.

However, in order to provide other stations and/or networks with an opportunity to get brief game/highlight footage, approved camera positions will be available at certain locations **outside** the boards around the perimeter or at various places on the concourse level or press box, provided your position at no time blocks the view of spectators nor presents a fire access hazard. **Please ensure that your camera has no visible logo. If so, please cover it up.**

You are allowed to air two minutes of game footage daily, provided the game footage is not from a game being televised as the feature game by TSN, in which case you must use their highlights with the appropriate credit.

The main media scrum takes place at ice level near the media bench. There will be an appropriate backdrop/signage noting the area. All players will pass by this area en route to their dressing rooms.

TV cameras must allow the media scrum to first interview any requested players before arranging individual interviews. However, cameras may be part of any scrum. For TV non rights-holders, you are allowed to air as much footage from the scrums as you wish.

When all games have been completed for any draw **AND** when TSN/World Curling TV has concluded its telecast and is off the air, you are allowed to do 'stand-ups' or interviews at ice level on the carpeted areas, near the scoreboards or even inside the boards, provided you are not disrupting the ice technicians as they prepare the surface for the next draw.

For brief live hits, if TSN/World Curling TV is not on the air, you will be able to do stand-ups on the concourse, seating areas, etc., providing any lighting requirements have been pre-approved. **When TSN/World Curling TV is on the air, NO live hits are allowed.**

CURLING CANADA PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES



All photographers must be identified with a B4 credential. You must also wear black/dark colour clothing and shoes.

In general, you are allowed to shoot from positions between the hoglines (starting about two metres from each hogline) on the carpeted areas separating the game sheets; in the corners of the arena; or behind the hack signs/scoreboards, provided you are not obscuring the vision of the spectators, blocking the scoreboard or in the way of the players.

Before entering the ice surface, please ensure that you have used the shoe cleaner, located near the home-end entrance, to remove dust, dirt and other particles from your shoes.

You are not allowed on the ice surface at any time.

Also:

- Flashes are not allowed.
- If you are carrying a mobile device, turn it to silent before entering the ice surface.
- No video can be shot from inside the boards.
- Please photograph from a sitting or squatting position; not standing or kneeling. Please shift your position at appropriate intervals to not consistently block the view of the same spectators.
- When moving along the walkway, ensure that no player is in the process of delivering a rock. If the curler is delivering, please wait until the deliver is complete before crossing the carpet at the end of the sheet.
- When a player is about to deliver a stone, you must be behind the hack signs/scoreboards, or situated between the hoglines.
- For playoff games, special instructions will be issued for photo locations in conjunction with the location of TSN's cameras. In general, though, you should avoid being in the TSN shot at all times.

Thank you for your co-operation.

Failure to adhere to these regulations could result in the forfeiture of your photography credential.

FACT SHEET

OFFICIAL NAME: 2022 BKT Tires & OK Tire World Women's Curling Championship, presented by Nature's Bounty

DATE/SITE: March 19-27, 2022 - CN Centre, Prince George, B.C.

SEATING CAPACITY: 5,971

FORMAT: Thirteen teams compete in a 12-game round robin. The top two teams in the standings advance directly to the semifinals. The third through sixth ranked teams compete in qualification games (3 vs. 6; 4 vs. 5) with the winners advancing to the semifinals. The semifinal winners play in the gold-medal game and the losers play for bronze.

No tiebreakers will be played, so ties for playoff spots are to be broken based on head-to-head results, and if that doesn't resolve the tie, then the pre-game Last-Shot Draw distances will be used.

NO TICK ZONE (NEW): As part of the World Curling Federation's *Maximizing the Value* the No-Tick Zone rule will be applied at the 2022 world women's and men's curling championships.

- The No-Tick Zone applies to any stone in the free guard zone touching the centre line while the free guard zone rule is in effect;
- If an opponent's stone is moved from the No-Tick Zone while the free guard zone rule is in effect, it is treated in the same manner as a violation of the free guard zone rule;
- A stone residing in the No-Tick Zone while the free guard zone rule is in effect may be touched and moved by an opponent's stone, so long as it remains touching the centre line in the free guard zone when it comes to rest;
- If the two skips are unable to agree whether a stone is in the No-Tick Zone, the umpire will be called upon to make the determination using the same tool used to determine whether a stone is over the hog line.

GAME DURATION:	Ten ends are scheduled with extra end(s) to break tied games. A minimum of eight (8) must be completed in the play-off games, in any other games a minimum of six (6) ends must be completed. Extra end(s) will be played to break tied games.
GAME TIMING:	<p>Thinking time will be used for this event. Each team receives 38 minutes to complete a ten-end game. Extra ends will be four minutes and 30 second (4:30) of thinking time for each team. A team's clock begins:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Once the opposing team has completed their shot, all rocks have come to rest and moved behind the back line; AND • the opposing team's sweepers have moved to the side of the sheet; AND • the opposition in charge of the house has relinquished control of the house; AND • the person in charge of the house (the delivering team) has taken control of the house. <p>A team's game clock stops once the stone has reached the nearest tee-line at the delivery end.</p>
TIMEOUTS:	<p>Each team is allotted one, 60-second timeout (plus travel time). The timeout must be signaled to the umpire and time clock operator. Either a coach OR alternate may attend the timeout, but not both. A translator may also attend if required.</p> <p>The fifth-end break will be five minutes.</p> <p>Both teams will receive one 60-second timeout to play in any extra end during that game.</p>
LAST STONE DRAW (LSD):	<p>The team listed first in the draw schedule for the round robin games will play the stones with the dark-coloured handles; the team listed second will play with the stones with the light coloured handles.</p> <p>For games requiring Last Stone Draws (LSD), at the conclusion of each team's pre-game practice, two stones will be delivered to the tee at the home end, by different players – the first stone with a clockwise and the second with a counter-clockwise rotation. A player (alternate) that delivers or sweeps an LSD stone does not have to play in that game. Sweeping is allowed.</p> <p>The first stone will be measured and removed from play before the second stone is delivered. The distances recorded for each stone will be added together to give the team its LSD total for that game. The team with the lesser LSD total will have the choice of delivering the first or second stone in the first end of that game. If the LSD totals for both teams are the same, the individual LSD stones are compared and the best non-equal LSD has the choice of delivering first or second stone in the first end. When both teams have the exact same individual LSD stone distances, a coin toss will be used to determine that choice.</p>
PLAYOFF GAMES, STONE SELECTION & LAST STONE ADVANTAGE:	<p>When round robin play (one group) is used at WCF competitions, with each competing team playing all other teams, stone colour and first stone in the first end of post round robin games is determined as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The team with the better win/loss record has the choice of stone colour and playing first or second stone in the first end. (ii) If the teams have the same win/loss record, the winner of their round robin game has the choice of stone colour or playing first or second stone in the first end.
