



CMDR (Canadian Mixed Doubles Ranking) 2022 – 2023

Revised July - 2022

The following updates/clarifications are being made to the CMDR for the 2022-23 Season:

Due to the cancellation of the 2022 Mixed Doubles Curling Trials and the 2022 Canadian Mixed Doubles Curling Championship (CMDCC), the qualifying period for the 2023 CMDCC will include all events from the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons (August 12, 2021, to March 12, 2023).

Tier 1 Events will be all registered MD events with a purse greater than \$20,000 CAD (or equivalent). The total purse must also be \$5,000 greater than the combined entry fees collected from all registered teams. 16-team minimum registration required.

Tier 2 (and lower) MD Events with less than 16 registered teams will now receive a pro-rated number of points. For example, an event with 12 teams will receive 75% (12/16) of the total amount of points normally allocated to the Event. Events with more than 16 teams registered will continue to receive the maximum 100% allocated to that tier.

Tier 2 (and lower) MD Events must have a minimum of 8 teams to have CMDR points awarded to that Event.

A maximum of 50% of teams in a MD event can receive qualifying points. For example, a maximum of 6 teams can be awarded qualifying points in a 12-Team event. This does not include teams who do not qualify but received points-per-win for the Round Robin.

After consultation and consideration, the implementation of a Strength of Field Multiplier to MD events will be deferred until at least the 2023-24 season.

CMDR team points will be accumulated as below for the 2022/2023 season:

- The 2021/23 CMDR for 2023 CMDCC Qualification includes a team's best seven (7) results from mixed doubles events and/or a maximum of 2 CTRS results from August 12, 2021 to March 12, 2023). There are no carry over points from prior seasons.
- CMDR points will continue to be earned on an individual basis, meaning you still do not need to be playing with your teammate to earn CMDR points in a MD event.
- Each individual is required to play in a minimum of 2 MD events with their partner over the qualifying period to be considered eligible for a CMDCC Berth.
- Players can earn CTRS points towards their Canadian Mixed Doubles Rankings. An individual's CTRS points earned are 25% of the teams total CTRS points earned in the event.

Team eligibility to qualify by CMDR points for the 2022 Canadian Mixed Doubles Championships:

- The qualifying process for the 2023 Canadian Mixed Doubles Curling Championship is covered in more detail in a separate document on the Curling Canada Website.

How to accumulate points:

- WCF World Team Ranking Events
- Provincial or Territorial Playdowns
- Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship
- World Mixed Doubles Championship
- CTRS – points given will be announced at a future date.

In order for 2022/23 Tiered events to count towards CMDR points, the event must be registered with the WCF World Team Rankings prior to December 15th, 2022 and not less than 30 days prior to the start of the event.

An event will be considered officially registered by emailing event details (Location, Date, Purse, Registration Information) to both Scott Pfeifer (scottpcurling@gmail.com) and CurlingZone (gerry@curlingzone.com) at least 30 days in advance.

In events where a pay-per-win format is utilized, a maximum of 30% of the event purse may be allocated to the pay-per-win proceeds of the event. At least 70% of the event purse must be paid to the event qualifiers.

Tier 1 – WCF World Team Ranking Mixed Doubles Events

- Event purse must be greater than \$20,000 CAD or equivalent.
- Event purse must be at least \$5,000 greater than the combined entry fees collected.
- Minimum 16-Team field.
 - 1st – 46 points
 - 2nd – 38 points
 - 3rd & 4th – 32 points
 - 5th – 8th – 26 points
 - 9th – 13th – 20 points
 - Non qualifying teams – 3 points per win

Tier 2 – WCF World Team Rankings Mixed Doubles Events

- Event entry fee must be greater than or equal to \$400. Minimum 8-Team field.
 - 1st – 32 points
 - 2nd – 26 points
 - 3rd & 4th – 20 points
 - 5th – 8th – 16 points
 - Non qualifying teams – 2 points per win

Tier 3 - WCF World Team Rankings Mixed Doubles Events

- Event entry fee must be greater than or equal to \$250. Minimum 8-Team field.
 - 1st – 24 points
 - 2nd – 20 points
 - 3rd & 4th – 16 points
 - 5th – 8th – 12 points

Tier 4 - WCF World Team Rankings Mixed Doubles Events

- Event entry fee must be greater than or equal to \$100. Minimum 8-Team field.
 - 1st – 18 points
 - 2nd – 14 points
 - 3rd & 4th – 11 points
 - 5th – 8th – 8 points

*** If the Fields for Tier 2, 3, or 4 events are less than 16 teams but greater than or equal to 8 teams, the points awarded will be pro-rated to the amount of teams entered.**

Provincial/Territorial Championships

- Minimum 12 teams entered to compete for a Championship, which includes regional/zone competitions.
 - 1st – 30 points
 - 2nd – 24 points
 - 3rd – page playoff – 20 points
 - 4th – page playoff – 16 points (3rd & 4th – 18 points)
 - 5th – 8th – 14 points

Provincial/Territorial Championships

- Less than 12 teams entered to compete for a Championship.
 - 1st – 16 points
 - 2nd – 12 points
 - 3rd – page playoff – 8 points
 - 4th – page playoff – 6 points (3rd & 4th – 7 points)
 - 5th – 8th – 4 points

Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship

- 1st – 50 points
- 2nd – 40 points
- 3rd & 4th – 32 points
- 5th – 8th – 24 points
- 9th – 12th – 18 points
- Round robin wins – 3 points
