## **CURLING CANADA**

#### **Curling Canada - High Performance Training/Competition Bonus Program** 2022-2023

#### **Bonus Funds:**

Any Canadian team is eligible for the Bonus funds, including those already in the National Team Program.

The funds (receipt driven) will be awarded to the top **four** CTRS teams points as at December 19, 2022, based on a team's results from 4 events listed below.

- 1. The National
- 2. Tour Challenge
- 3. Masters
- 4. One other CTRS event

The funds will be made available on January 1, 2023.

 $\begin{array}{l} 1^{st} & = \$48,000 \\ 2^{nd} & = \$40,000 \\ 3^{rd} & = \$32,000 \\ 4^{th} & = \$24,000 \end{array}$ 

Receipts will be required for all expenditures.

**Note**; please keep receipts from the above 4 events as the receipts from these events will be eligible to submit an expense claim.

### Athletes Assistance Program (AAP) Carding Assignment:

Any Canadian athlete is eligible to receive AAP support based on the below criteria as outlined in the CURLING CANADA, ABLE-BODIED NATIONAL TEAM/CARDING PROGRAM, 2022/2023 STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES document.

Priority #5 – Sport Canada National Criteria (SR/C1)

If there are any remaining cards available to distribute they will be awarded based on a team's results from the start of the 2022/2023 season. (August 1 – December 19, 2022)

Performance Based Criteria – Teams CTRS point total as at December 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022 from the 3 grand slam events in the fall and one other CTRS event result. Cards will be awarded to athletes, in order, based on their CTRS results.

Cards for 6 or 4 months will be distributed until the carding funds are consumed.

The 5<sup>th</sup> player is not eligible for this card.

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**Note** – A minimum of eight athletes per gender will be eligible to receive 6 months of carding starting January 1, 2023. (SR level, previously senior carded athlete = \$1,765 per month, C1 level, new senior carded athlete = \$1,060 per month)
