

2026-2027 Team Travel & Funding Policies

Curling Canada continues to face budget pressures driven by reductions in core funding, rising travel and event delivery costs, limited staff resources, and increasing complexity in coordinating team travel.

Additionally, as more teams opt to stay offsite rather than at designated host hotels, accommodation costs for teams have risen. This shift has also resulted in the loss of grant funding tied to room nights and a decline in interest from prospective event hosts.

In response, and with the goal of providing greater cost certainty, maintaining travel support for teams, reducing administrative demands on staff, and offering teams increased flexibility and control over their travel arrangements to and from each Championship, Curling Canada has finalized the following updates to the team travel and funding policies for the 2026–2027 season.

ACCOMODATIONS

Stay-to-Play Policy

All teams, athletes and/or coaches participating in Curling Canada's Championship Events are required to stay at the Curling Canada Host Hotel(s), and to book their accommodations through the event's official channels, **in order to be eligible to compete**. The minimum room requirement per team will be confirmed in the applicable Event Competitors' Guide.

Of note: The Stay-to-Play Policy **does not apply to the Canadian Wheelchair Curling Championship**. To ensure participants have access to accommodations that meet their individual accessibility requirements and recognizing the limited inventory of accessible guest rooms at many hotels, teams and participants may arrange accommodations outside of the designated host hotel(s) where necessary.

Wheelchair Championship	Each team will receive a \$1,000 travel subsidy to be used as necessary. Curling Canada will provide discounted rates at the Host Hotel. Teams wishing to stay at the Host Hotel must complete and submit a Hotel Booking Form to confirm a reservation. Teams will be required to provide a credit card, upon arrival, for payment.

PER DIEMS

Please find below, information pertaining to per diem amounts allocated for each of Curling Canada's SOC and Non-SOC events.

FLIGHTS

Teams, athletes and/or coaches are responsible for arranging and booking their own flights. For all SOC Events, where a full travel subsidy is offered, an expense form must be submitted, along with the accompanying flight itinerary and receipt. Only the amount equivalent to the lowest refundable fare will be reimbursed (i.e. standard fare flights).

For Non-SOC Events, where a set travel subsidy is offered, it is calculated based on an average of regional location costs of air travel from local airports to the host location as of November 1 each year (based on standard fares). Subsidy amounts are region-based (Atlantic, Territories,

Quebec/Ontario, Prairies, West). Teams will be paid the subsidy following qualification (assuming all deposit information is provided to Curling Canada in a timely manner).

For teams driving, as opposed to flying, a mileage rate of \$0.53/km will be provided for one round trip (one vehicle).

GROUND TRANSPORTATION

All teams, athletes and/or coaches participating in Curling Canada Championship Events are responsible for arranging their own ground transportation between the airport, hotel, and curling venue.

*In the event VIP Shuttle Services are provided for SOC Events, and the proximity between the Venue and Host Hotel is within walking distance, and/or the facilities are attached, reimbursement for ground transportation will not be provided. Details for each specific event will be confirmed in the Competitors' Guide.

EXPENSES & REIMBURSEMENTS

All teams are required to complete the online expense form within 30 days of competing at the event. Online expense forms will be provided in the Team Information Document, in the weeks leading up to the event. Only expenses supported by original receipts (and flight itineraries or google maps where applicable) will be reimbursed.

Teams will only receive one total reimbursement for all the team's expenses, deposited into the account on file.

The following items are NOT covered nor eligible for reimbursement

- Taxi/Ubers
- Airport parking charges
- Luggage charges
- Seat upgrades
- Personal expenses (e.g. room service)

Should you have any questions or if you require clarification regarding the above details, please contact the Event Manager assigned to the respective event in which you/your team are participating.

Note: Curling Canada team funding will include up to four players and one coach only. Teams will be allowed to bring one alternate player with them but at their own team's expense, including on-ice clothing.
